



Regional Spring Garden Care Tips

Early Spring – North

A great time to get ready to garden (Time before the final frost of winter)

- Work organic matter into the soil
- Clean up garden debris
- Fertilize shrubs and perennials
- Plant cool-weather plants and vegetables, such as radishes, peas and lettuce
- Repot indoor plants using moisture-control potting mix, such as Miracle-Gro® Moisture Control® Potting Mix
- Water right after planting and feed with a transplant seedling starter

Late Spring – North

(Time after the last frost of winter; typically marked by Mother's Day)

- Spread compost or mulch on garden beds
- Plant annuals, divide perennials
- Prune spring-blooming shrubs after flowering
- Amend area with a complete garden soil, such as Miracle-Gro® Garden Soil for Flowers and Vegetables
- Plant warm-weather vegetables, such as tomatoes and zucchini
- Water right after planting and feed with an all-purpose plant food; for in-ground plants, use a slow-release plant food

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Late Spring – South

(Time after the last frost of winter; typically mid-March)

- Spread compost or mulch on garden beds
- Plant annuals and divide perennials
- Prune spring-blooming shrubs after flowering
- Plant warm-weather vegetables, such as tomatoes and zucchini
- Water immediately after planting
- Feed plants an all-purpose plant food; for in-ground plants, use a slow-release plant food, such as Miracle-Gro® Shake 'N Feed® Continuous Release Plant Food
